Apr. 24 - Student Produces Weekly School News Video

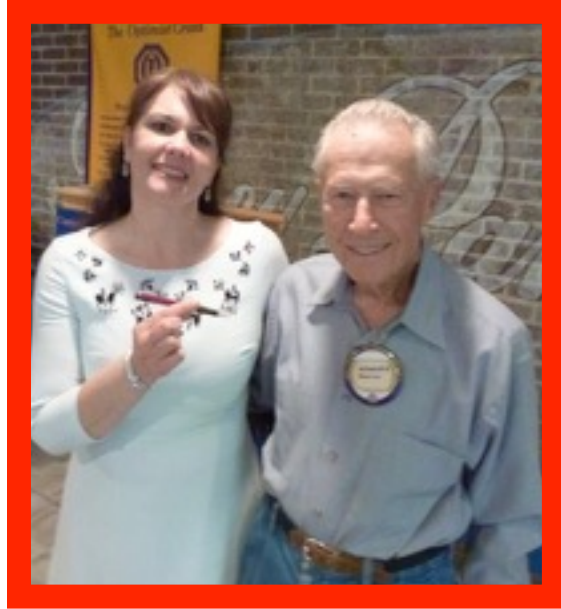
Sophia Valencia, a fifth grade student at Camarillo Heights STEM (Science Technology Engineering and Math) Academy, received the **Youth We Appreciate Award** from **Chantelle Limon** of the **Camarillo Noontime Optimist Club** at their luncheon ceremony at Money Pancho Restaurant. **Jennifer Paterson**, Sophia's teacher, informed the audience that her 10-year-old student excels in all curriculum areas and is a constant role model for the school's **Junior Optimist Club**. She noted that Sophia serves on the school's news crew and produces a weekly news video using Green Screen technology. As part of her club activities she also helps in the annual holiday food drive and works with senior citizens during Thanksgiving. Of special note, she was cited for always helping others and ensuring that every single student feels included each day. She earned \$100 for her school as part of the YWA Award recognition. Dr. Penelope DeLeon, Superintendent of the Oxnard Union High

School District, shared her vision of the importance of every student receiving a diploma. With her usual enthusiasm, experience and optimism she explained how each student, the Monday after their Friday graduation ceremony should have a well conceived plan and a direction for their lives, and be prepared to carry it out.



As a bilingual classroom-oriented educator with more than two decades of experience teaching, a mother of three, who holds two master's degrees and a doctorate degree in organizational leadership, **Dr. DeLeon** started teaching high school Spanish and English language development at Upland and Chaffey unified school districts before serving as an assistant principal at Riverside and Yucaipa unified districts. In 2012, she was hired as director of professional development for the Fontana district and was appointed deputy chief of secondary schools in 2014. She took over as Oxnard Union High School District Superintendent last May with

the promise to “help every single student.”

OUHSD board member, Steve Hall said, “Throughout her career she has worked to close the achievement gap by nurturing strong parent and community engagement while promoting a culture of collaboration, support and collegiality for all stakeholders.” As one of our honored guest speakers and presenters at the **Annual Camarillo Noontime Optimist Club High School Youth Banquet and Award Night** in March, **Dr. DeLeon** got all five high school student, parent and staff groups cheering and applauding when she yelled out their respective school mascot names and welcomed them to the event!
